Matter: Application seeking review of a barring notice issued pursuant to section 115AD of the *Liquor Control Act 1988*.

Date of Determination: 17 November 2014

Determination (on papers):

1. On 28 August 2014 the Commissioner of Police ("the Police") issued a notice barring the applicant from entering any licensed premises within Western Australia, except those licensed under a liquor store licence, for a period of 6 months ("the barring notice").
2. On 23 September 2014, the applicant applied to the Liquor Commission for a review of the barring notice.
3. The parties have conferred in relation to the application.
4. Mr W accepts his conduct was not appropriate, but sought an exception to attend family functions during the Christmas period.
5. Having regard to Mr W's insight, the Police have agreed to amend the barring notice and therefore by consent, the

the terms of the barring notice are varied as follows:

Mr TPW is prohibited from entering any licensed premises in Western Australia for a period of 6 months except those premises licensed hereunder:

- a. a liquor store licence;
- b. a restaurant licence issued under section 50 (that are not subject to an extended trading permit issued under section 60(4)(ca); and
- c. a special facility licence issued under section 46 (and regulation 9A of the *Liquor Control Regulations 1989*) for the purpose of; theatre or cinema; transport; vocational education and training course; bed and breakfast facility or room service restaurant.
